MEMORANDUM OF INTENT for a Child

Our Intent

This Memorandum provides guidance to the guardian of our minor children with respect to child rearing practices, important choices and our wishes regarding our children's care. This memorandum is to be considered binding to the extent possible. However, we recognize that there may be circumstances that we cannot anticipate, so we request that all parties concerned act in accordance with our intent as set forth in this memorandum. We appoint the guardian of our minor children to carry out our wishes and desires as expressed herein. We direct our trustee to support our guardian to the greatest extent possible in honoring these instructions.

Our estate plan utilizes a Revocable Living Trust, Pour-over Will, and other documents. Should this memorandum conflict with any provision of our primary estate planning documents, i.e. our Revocable Living Trust or Pour-over Will, our Revocable Living Trust shall take precedence followed by our Pour-over Will.
